President's Report

Hello Members

On Saturday 13 September Forster Gallery had a stand at the **2nd Forster Chamber Spring Festival**. Thanks to Bettina Digby, Brett Newbold, Lorraine Millward, Vicki Bullard, Maria Evans, Liz Ho, Bev Gordon, Pat Mackaway, Kaylee Rands, Jake Rands, Karen Rands ... and me for: transporting our gazebo and erecting it, decorating it with past exhibition posters, selling cards, handing out free bookmarks and talking up a storm! Bettina created a lovely still life charcoal drawing in real time – a big attraction for passers-by to notice Forster Gallery. We sold \$150 worth of raffle tickets, sold 25 cards and handed out about a dozen membership forms – a great result!

This busy September culminated in a very successful Awards Ceremony for our dual Exhibitions: Forster Gallery **2025 Young Artists' Exhibition and Midcoast Council's Koala Art Competition.**

On Sunday 21 September we welcomed over 200 guests to our front lawn for the awarding of certificates and prizes. Mayor Claire Pontin awarded the Council Koala prizes and Sharon Clifton from Ingenia Lifestyle Kokomo awarded our Young Artist prizes. Ingenia Lifestyle Kokomo are our newest sponsor and they very generously paid \$1,000 to cover entry fees for our young artists as well as \$1,800 in prizemoney and then topped it off with the donation of a 'Pamper-Hamper', valued at \$500 for our raffle prize. Thank you, Ingenia Lifestyle Kokomo. The raffle is drawn on 19 October, so time yet to get your tickets!

It takes a lot of work to mount an exhibition, let alone two concurrently. Thank you to:

- Toni de Bruin, our Exhibition Co-ordinator, and her hanging team
- To our marketing team for getting us noticed in print, on the radio, on social media and on Channel 9
- Lorraine Beal for the design of posters, catalogue covers and certificates
- All those who helped cook, prepare and distribute the delicious afternoon tea
- The helpers who welcomed visitors, sold raffle tickets and sold works of art.

If you haven't already visited these exhibitions may I encourage you not to miss the experience? For the Young Artists' Exhibition, we have 183 works from 155 students from eight high schools in our district. The creativity and colour leap off the walls!

The Young Artists Exhibition is on seven days a week from 10am to 4pm in order to take advantage of school holiday visitors, therefore **we need lots of help with the Roster**. **Please** help Maria with her difficult job by contacting her now rather than waiting for her to ask you.

LAND'S EDGE FOUNDATION

Land's Edge Foundation is a not-for-profit that works with schoolchildren to connect them to their natural environment. In November this year they are bringing 135 Year 10 students from Methodist Ladies College Sydney to the Forster Tuncurry area for three days of activities on and around the lakes and beaches.

They approached Forster Gallery and asked if we would run an art class for the students. We have agreed to conduct 9 classes of 15 students each. On Day 1 Bettina Digby will be leading the painting, on Day 2 Christine Rands will be leading the Drawing and on Day 3 Ariane Belle will be leading the Collage. We are compiling a list of assistants to help all three of us run three courses each day. If you want to help in some way contact president@forstergallery.org.

We are charging each student \$45 which will include all materials they need for each course. As our leaders are donating their time the Gallery should profit to the tune of \$4,000+. Just at the right time, as we **must** fix our floor and cannot be guaranteed a grant.

This will mean that courses normally run on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday will not be available on 11, 12 and 13th November. Your committee believes the profit to be made makes this a justifiable disruption to normal service and thank you for you co-operation.

WHY????

It has come to my notice that some members wonder why we hold the Young Artists' Exhibition and the Council's Koala Exhibition as well as participating in the Spring Fair.

Here are four reasons why this is necessary:

1) Our vision and mission statements:

OUR VISION

A community place for visual art.

OUR MISSION


To inspire creativity and learning, share ideas, enable the development of friendships & provide a platform for the promotion and appreciation of visual art.

- 2) Our running costs are \$32,000 per annum. The \$5 the gallery takes from each class you attend is not enough to cover running costs, let alone any maintenance that needs doing. We rely on exhibition entry fees and sales commission to keep us viable.
- 3) For major maintenance issues i.e. the upcoming replacement of the floor, we need grants. All grants' bodies insist on the applicant being able to demonstrate their connection with, and commitment to, their local community.
- 4) We, as current members, are reaping the benefits of those who came before us. It is incumbent on us to do the same; to make Forster Gallery a place to belong, to reach out and attract our future members and leaders.

Treasurer's Report

The winter exhibition went well. We sold 10 paintings for a total of \$3,105. Feature wall exhibitor, Bettina Digby, sold 8 works for a total of \$3,950 (photo below right). This made total sales of \$7,055. The Gallery's commission on this exhibition came to a total of \$1,563.75. We had 140 local visitors to the Gallery during this time as well as 91 visitors from out of the area.




THINKING OF EXHIBITING 3D WORK?

Two new watercolour classes commencing Friday 24th October

Both classes are being offered in a five week block from 24 October to 28 November. Note that there is no class on Friday 31 October due to an important family event.

Advanced - 10am to 12pm

This is for painters with plenty of experience who would like advice on a current project, want to take their work in a new direction or would be producing work suitable for an exhibition.

Beginners/intermediate - 1pm to 3pm

The beginners group will be guided through a series of graduated small paintings, learning the skills of watercolour on the way. The intermediate group will learn professional tips and tricks, participate in learning exercises and to take their work to a more advanced level.

Both sets of classes are being delivered as a planned program so participants need to pay for the five classes up front. Cost is \$28 per class which is \$140 for the block.

Students are encouraged to use quality materials (eg Windsor and Newton paints) and good paper to get the best results.

For beginners ALL high quality materials can be supplied by the tutor for an extra fee and you bring nothing but your smile! (\$160).

Please note that due to this fee structure if there is an urgent need to miss a class Suzi will do her best to catch you up the following week.

Classes need a minimum of 5 students to run. Classes of more than 8 students will receive a discount.

PREPARING YOUR WORK FOR EXHIBITION

With presenter Bettina Digby Sunday, 26 October, 1.30pm at the Gallery

There will be a short talk followed by demonstrations on how to present your artwork for exhibition so it looks neat and professional and meets the expectations of Forster Gallery. It will also cover that thorny question of pricing your work. The presentation will include:

- Fixing & mounting works on paper
- Finishing oil, acrylic & other media on board or canvas
- Framing options
- DIY installation of hanging points
- Preparing 3D & sculpture
- Preparing small paintings
- Forster Gallery hanging requirements
- Pricing your work

As usual following the presentation there will be an opportunity for members to socialise and chat over a cuppa.

New printing classes!

Calling all printmakers! Next term Suzi Zglinicki will offer a Wednesday afternoon of printmaking. Some experience is preferred, but beginners are welcome, with the understanding that some printmaking processes may take a bit longer for a beginner. Cost will be \$30 per class, and students will need to pay for the first five classes up front. (\$150) This cost includes the supply of beginning materials for proof prints and the use of specialised equipment. A materials list will be supplied.

There will be some other materials required at an additional charge. This will all be discussed with participants via email prior to the course commencing. Suzi will then do a bulk order on your behalf saving a considerable amount on costs.

These classes will take place on Wednesday afternoon from 1.30pm to 3.30pm, commencing 22 October and finishing 19 November. Note that there will be no class on Wednesday 12 November as there is an external booking for the classroom on that day.











































