ANOTHER MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Ok for this piece I am putting on my 'serious pants', be warned.

ROSTERING

Maria Evans and Luanna Wells have the most frustrating job of any Committee member.

Even though we are all aware of our responsibilities in terms of doing Gallery Duty (I have detailed them below in case our new members are unaware), they both spend countless hours EVERY week chasing up members to do duty. *This is unfair and unreasonable.*

You might say "but I don't exhibit, I only attend classes" or "I exhibit occasionally but I don't attend classes".

I say the reality is without the one you do not have the other. As a volunteer-led, not-for-profit, Forster Gallery relies on different sources of funds to keep the doors open. Remember, our base running costs are \$35,000pa. This includes membership fees, raffles, donations, class fees, workshop fees, exhibition entry fees and commission on sales.

Keeping the doors open as often as we can (especially during school holiday periods) is in ALL our best interests. So, may I ask you all to be proactive about doing gallery duty i.e. email rosters@forstergallery.org with days and times you are available **in advance** of the changeover of exhibitions. Our aim should be to have a full roster for the period of a new exhibition on the day it opens.

Rules of Gallery Duty

One duty is determined as either 10am – 1pm OR 1pm – 4pm during Summer or 10am – 2pm when we are on Winter hours.

If you are **exhibiting** in the current exhibition you are expected to do:

- ⇒ at least two duties during the period of the exhibition
- ⇒ however, for **The Forster Art Prize** and **Behind the Door and Under the Bed,** when we are open seven days a week in full gallery mode, you are expected to do between three and four duties.

If you are **not exhibiting** in any exhibitions you are expected to do:

 \Rightarrow at least one duty per quarter i.e. four per year (note this used to be one per year, but that is not working so the Committee voted this increase)

If you are **exhibiting in two or less exhibitions** per year you are expected to do:

- ⇒ the duties associated with that exhibition, plus
- ⇒ two extra duties per year

New members will be partnered with experienced members for as long as it takes them to feel comfortable with our procedures – normally 2-3 duties and you will be competent.



Workshop Description






